AN EMERGENCY SITUATION SHALL BE DEEMED TO EXIST IF TWO OFFICERS OF THE BOARD DECLARE AN EMERGENCY. MINUTES SHALL BE KEPT AND DECISIONS COMMUNICATED TO THE BOARD WITHIN FIVE BUSINESS DAYS. THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MET FOUR TIMES DURING THE YEAR.
